Mrs. Rhonda Mueller, from the audience, stated the JHTC would not qualify as their service is not broad enough, and the money will only be used for the community. Mrs. Mueller stated it would be wise to call three times and speak to three different people. If one person says you will qualify, you take their name and ID number and then they have to qualify the Council. Ms. Richter stated it still might be wise to apply for "Non-Profit Corporation" status and Mrs. Mueller stated there might be other ways to help. Ms Richter will continue follow up on this.
